

We are committed to the health and safety of our campers, employees, and community in light of the outbreak of COVID-19 across the country. In order to prioritize health and safety along with our commitment to our campers at Bush Park, we have monitored state, local and CDC guidance, in addition to reaching out directly to the Governor's Office and Middlesex County to ensure that we are following both required and best practices.

We have received confirmation today, May 1, 2020, that Executive Order 55 restricts private campgrounds to stays of at least 14 nights; however, so long as social distancing is observed, such campgrounds may remain open. Middlesex County has provided new guidance, as well. Our current limited opening date is May 8, 2020, with certain limitations as follow:

PLEASE NOTE:

ALL ACCESS TO BUSH PARK CAMPGROUND IS AT YOUR OWN RISK.

1. Campers must adhere to strict social distancing recommendations, enhanced sanitizing practices on common surfaces, and applying the relevant guidance from CDC.
2. Stays must be at least 14 nights.
3. All amenities will be closed until further notice, except the boat docks. If our staff is able to provide access to bath house #1 and the camp store laundry, and adhere to CDC guidance, we will offer access to those amenities when possible, subject to closure at any time for health and safety reasons.
4. Groups or gatherings of more than 10 people are prohibited in accordance with the Governor's Executive Order 55. The Governor's FAQs recommend that any person observing a social gathering of 10 or more contact local law enforcement.
5. Campers should keep a distance of at least 6 feet from others at all times. While on right of ways, the docks, or any area accessible by others, please step aside to let others pass at a safe distance.

OUR STAFF IS NOT PROVIDING SERVICE TO ANY AMENITIES AND IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR ENFORCEMENT OF SOCIAL DISTANCING UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE. IF YOU HAVE CONCERNS, PLEASE STAY HOME OR CALL LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT.
